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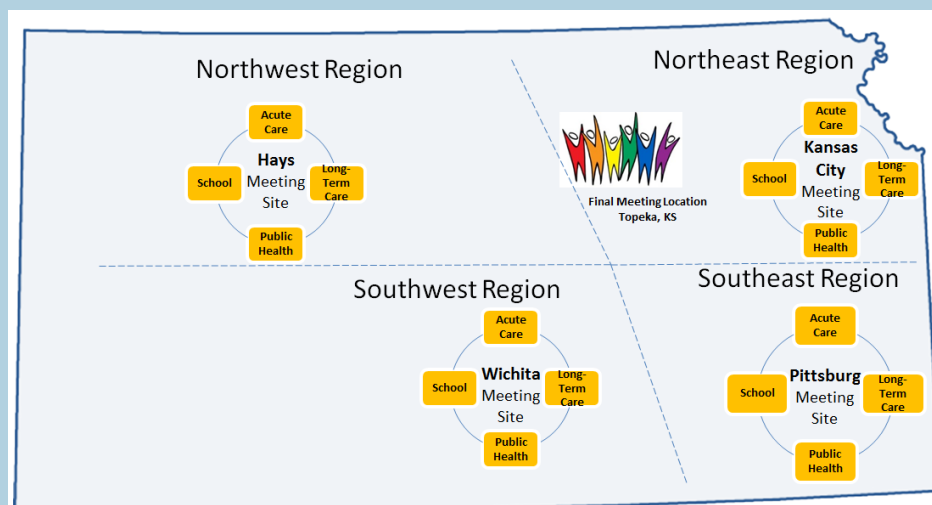

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The KNLR Program is a comprehensive program for nurses interested in improving their leadership knowledge and skills. We are recruiting RN Residents from **Four Specialty** areas of practice:

• Acute Care	• Public Health
• Long-Term Care	• School Health

The KNLR program will be offered in **Four Regions** across Kansas:

• Northwest	• Southeast	• Northeast	• Southwest
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Two RNs from each specialty area in each region (32 total) will be selected.

Application Process

- ◆ Online application form, including a 200 word statement of personal goal(s) to be achieved upon completion of the program
- ◆ Support from the applicant's employer and mentor
- ◆ Identification of preferred region for participation
- ◆ Application must be submitted by January 15, 2016

WHAT TO EXPECT

- The KNLR Program will be offered **FREE of cost!**
- The Program will run from February 2016 through July 2016
- The Program includes 4 in-person meetings, and 4 online modules (timeline on back of brochure)
- Each region has a Regional Leader to facilitate each of the three regional in-person meetings.
- Nurse Residents will complete a small leadership project intended to benefit the Resident's organization or community
- Nurse Residents will convene in Topeka, KS in July for the final meeting to network, share project outcomes, and evaluate the KNLR Program. Supervisors and Mentors are encouraged/invited to attend.
- Upon successful completion of the KNLR Program, Nurse Residents will receive a KNLR certificate
